



Snowy River Project Update

Federation Mining is pleased to provide an update on our progress at the Snowy River Gold Mine near Reefton on the South Island in New Zealand.

Diamond Drilling

Diamond drilling continued with two underground diamond rigs in June, with 1,136.8 m of drilling completed (239.4m dewatering drilling and 897.4m of resource definition drilling).

A total of 2,886.8m of drilling have now been completed at the project to date.

A highlight of the month and a major project milestone was the successful completion of the first dewatering hole from underground. This is the culmination of many months of careful planning and engineering design work by Federation Mining, Alton Drilling, and Mineright (an Australian consultancy specialised in mine dewatering).

The historic Blackwater workings are flooded and need to be dewatered. A gently upward inclined, 260.1m deep, diamond drill hole was drilled across from the 17 Crosscut, intersecting the historic working near the base of the 14 Level.

The hole intersected high pressure water as expected, which has been contained at the hole collar by a specially designed standpipe. Water samples have been taken and submitted for laboratory analysis and planning is underway to begin pumping of the water and treatment through the site water treatment system.



Exploration drilling continued to return encouraging results from testing of the Birthday Reef. Three holes were completed during the month.

SRD006 targeting the reef 220 metres below the reef intersected 4 metres of quartz veining (3 metre true width), which is the widest intersection of reef that has been drilled at the project to date. Several small specks of very fine visible gold were observed. Assay results are pending.

SRD007 and SRD009 both intersected the reef at their respective targeted positions 100m and 60m below 16 Level. Fine visible gold was observed in both reef intersections.

Assay results have been received for hole *SRD001* to *SRD005* and are shown in the table on page 3.

The highlights of the Birthday Reef drilling program to date are *SRD002* which returned 0.8m at 38.1 g/t (200m below the workings) and *SRD005* which returned 1.2m at 19.5 g/t Au (150m below the historic workings).

Supporting information is included in the Table on page 3 (appendix). Federation will in addition provide a separate drilling overview which has been prepared in accordance with the JORC Code (2012) in the coming month.

The code is internationally recognised for the reporting of exploration results, mineral resources, and mineral reserves.

Decline Development

111 metres was safely developed in the declines this month. This included both the Main and North declines as well as ancillary development for drill cuddies and cross cuts. Some of the ground has proved challenging this month with additional ground support and focus required.





Environment

All environmental monitoring was completed, and results were compliant.
