

Snowy River Project Update

Federation Mining is pleased to provide an update on our progress at the Snowy River Gold Mine near Reefton on the South Island in New Zealand.

Diamond Drilling

A total of 1,540 m of drilling was completed during month, bringing the total to 4,231m completed at the project to date. Two underground rigs are currently being utilised, with plans to mobilise a third rig to site next month.

The drilling program continued to return encouraging results from testing of the Birthday Reef. Three holes were completed during the month.

SRD013 and SRD014 both intersected the reef at their respective targeted positions 100m and 150m below the old Blackwater mine workings. Fine visible gold was observed in both reef intersections.

SRD012W1 intersected thin (<0.1m) mineralisation at the target position which is interpreted to be a pinched-out zone proximal to a cross cutting fault.

Assay results have been received for hole SRD006 to SRD009 and are shown in the Table on Page 3.

Decline Development

118 metres was safely developed in the declines this month.

The planned twin declines have been completed and the development focus has shifted to establishing suitable drill pads to support the diamond drilling program.

Project to date we have developed the following:

- 4317 metres in Main decline
- 3368 metres in North Decline
- 1095 metres of Ancillary development
- 8780 metres in total

The highlights of the results received in the month were SRD009 which returned 1.2m at 60.1 g/t (75m below the historic workings) and SRD006 which returned 2.75m at 8.8g/t Au (220m below the old workings).
