



Snowy River Project Update – October 2024

Federation Mining is pleased to provide an update on our progress at the Snowy River Gold Mine near Reefton on the South Island in New Zealand.

Corporate Update

Our corporate team continues to explore a variety of funding options for the next phase of the development of the Snowy River project. During the month Federation submitted a non-binding indicative offer for a potential transaction with Siren Gold Limited, negotiations between both parties were conducted over several weeks however the proposal did not proceed.

Project Update

The project currently employs 80 people along with 25 contractors from Alton Drilling supporting our diamond drilling program.

The site team has advanced underground development with 71 metres of decline development and 68 metres of ore drive development.

Dewatering of the historic Blackwater Mine workings continues, and all water is treated and released within our resource consent conditions.

Our operational focus over the coming months is setting up the underground operation for production through establishing access to the Birthday Reef via ore drives and completing the diamond drilling of deeper sections to improve our understand of the geology at depth.

Alton Drilling has 3 rigs onsite at present and have completed 11 holes so far this year with a number more underway as part of the deeper Panel B drilling (see update on Page 3).

Environment & Consent

All environmental consent monitoring was completed, and results were compliant. During the month we finalised our Scope 1 & 2 greenhouse gas emissions calculations for FY24. There was an increase observed in energy consumption which was expected due to the ramp up in our mining activity and extension of decline length from surface which increase distance travelled by mobile equipment and ventilation needs. Federation uses hydroelectric power and continues to focus on energy efficient solutions for our operation including suitable offsetting options to reduce our contribution to emissions.

Initial engineering design work has been completed for the intersection safety upgrade on Snowy River Road and State Highway 7 with site works expected to commence in the coming months.

About Federation Mining


